Intonation. English depends mainly on intonation, or pitch pattern ("melody"), to help the listener notice the most important (focus) word in a thought group. By making a major pitch change (higher or lower) on the stressed syllable of the focus word, the speaker gives emphasis to that word and thereby highlights it for the listener. This emphasis can indicate meaning, new information, contrast, or emotion.
